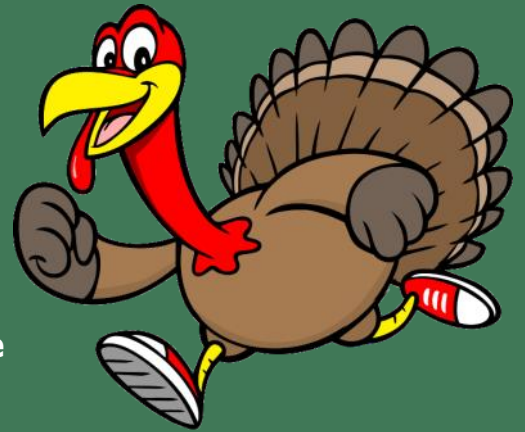

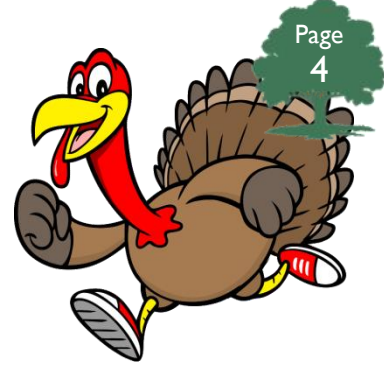

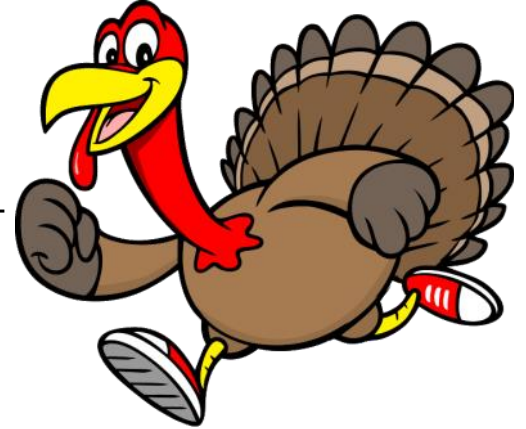

The goal of the Community Camera program is to deter crime and promote public safety through collaboration between the Fort Worth Police Department and the communities we serve. As crimes occur nearby, residents are not always aware that their system may have captured information that could help solve the crime, thus keeping our community safer. In turn, the police are also not always aware who may have this potentially vital information. Residents and businesses across the city can register their privately owned surveillance camera systems.

If necessary, FWPD will contact you directly, using the information provided by you at the time of registration, to ask you to review your video surveillance footage. Your voluntary participation in this program shall not be construed as an obligation to release any surveillance video to FWPD and all video surveillance footage shall remain the property of the registrant until it is released to FWPD.

COVENANT CORNER

SOLAR PANELS



There have been a number of requests about solar panels lately, sparked by a couple of companies soliciting Park Glen homeowners to install the devices on the roofs of houses. Solar panels are generally allowed in Park Glen but

require advance approval of the Architectural Control Committee. The Association's Solar Energy guidelines are included in the "Bulletins" on the Park Glen website (<http://parkglen.org/property-modification-acc.html>). Guidelines and an approval form for solar panels and any other kind of property modification can be found there as well.

Solar panels are an expensive investment with a long period of time before the benefit surpasses the cost. They produce "free" electricity which can be used by the resident of the home or sold into the electricity network to be used by others. Panels can be purchased by the homeowner much like a kitchen renovation, pool, or other home improvement, in which case any available tax credit goes to the homeowner but also the maintenance and repair costs (e.g. hailstorm). In another type of arrangement, a solar company will own the panels and lease the roof space from the homeowner in exchange for a lower electricity rate or monthly payments. This scenario generally requires a long-term contract that must be accepted by a future owner when the home is sold.

Solar panels can have a negative effect on resale of a home. Some people will find them unattractive or otherwise undesirable, reducing the pool of potentially interested buyers. Solar panels are unlikely to increase the value of a home because a new homebuyer could have the newest technology installed at any time, and prices are dropping every year. Panels and related hardware can be removed and reinstalled on another home but this is at significant cost for labor, repairing the roof, and adapting the panels to a different home than they were originally designed for.

Also keep in mind that the calculated benefit presented to you by a company trying to sell you solar panels would be exaggerated for someone who is paying too much for electricity now, so please make sure that you are paying the lowest possible price by shopping for a utility provider at www.powertochoose.org.

The bottom line is that the HOA is unlikely to be an obstacle to the installation of solar panels, but homeowners would be well-advised to do their research, fully understand all of the details, and make the best choice.

A property modification request is required by residents who want to make Improvements or modifications to your property. You can find the forms on our website.

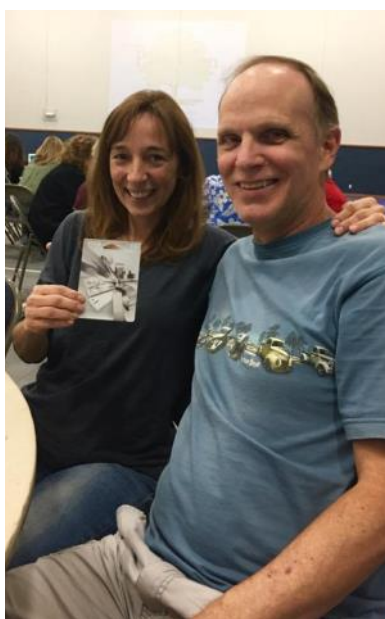

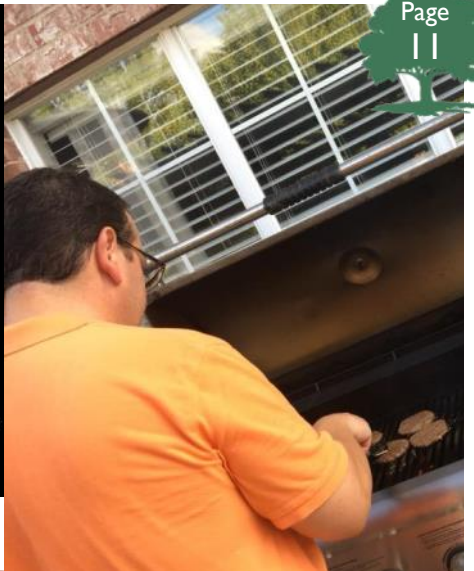

Halloween Holiday Trivia

Recipe - Leftover Halloween Candy Brownies

Ingredients

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup packed light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup butter, softened
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup candy-coated milk chocolate pieces (such as M&M's)
- 1/2 cup chopped peanut butter cups (such as Reese's)
- 1/2 cup chopped milk chocolate candy bars (such as Hershey's)
- 1/2 cup chopped chocolate-covered crispy peanut butter candy (such as Butterfinger)



Directions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9-inch square baking pan.
- Whisk 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons flour, baking powder, and salt together in a bowl. Beat brown sugar, butter, and vanilla extract together in a separate large bowl using an electric mixer until creamy; beat in egg.
- Gradually beat flour mixture into butter mixture until batter is just combined; fold in candy-coated milk chocolate pieces, peanut butter cups, chocolate-covered crispy peanut butter candy, and milk chocolate bars. Press batter into prepared baking pan.
- Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown, 20 to 25 minutes. Cool in pan for 10 minutes on a wire rack.
