Tips for HOA Members

Pay your dues. Paying your dues (only \$66 per year!) provides the funds that the community uses to operate, enforce the neighborhood's policies and provide activities and programs. When you don't pay, it produces a burden and distraction on the

Association and causes late fees, interest, and collection activity.

Stay in the loop. Sign up to receive e-mail alerts of Park Glen news and events. Read the monthly online newsletter. Visit www.ParkGlen.org at least monthly. Go to Board Meetings. Connect with Park Glen and other residents on Facebook.

Read your Covenants and Deed Restrictions carefully. When you're not under pressure to make a home improvement or have spring fever over new landscaping, read through the rules for our HOA. Be familiar with the do's and don'ts of our association and community.

Keep up the appearance of your home. Our community managers conduct regular drive-throughs of the neighborhood and also respond to complaints from homeowners. Ensuring that your property is maintained (yard weed-free, mowed, and thriving; trees and shrubs trimmed; fences in good repair; house paint and structure in good shape) will prevent violation notices and fines. Every week or so, take a look at your yard from the street and ask, "what would a prospective buyer think of my home?" If the answer is not so good, take action to correct the problems. Your neighbors and community are counting on you!

If you get a violations notice, don't ignore it. Instead, contact the community manager to discuss the problem. Something can probably be worked out to give you time to resolve the violation. If you just make contact, you can avoid additional letters and further action while you act.

Plan ahead. If you know you're planning a change to the appearance of your home, read the CC&Rs, and submit your Property Modification Request to the ACC (Architectural Control Committee) early (preferably months in advance). It can take a month to consider and decide on an application, and you want to have enough time to provide information, answer questions, change your plans, and/or possibly appeal a decision.

Most of all, relax and enjoy the peace of mind of living in a community with an active HOA. Your HOA is dedicated to maintaining the value and beauty of the whole neighborhood, and that's part of what you love about your home.

A property modification request is required prior to making improvements or modifications to your property. You can find the forms on our website.

Recipe Ideas for Christmas Morning



Easy French Toast Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 (8 ounce) loaf crusty French bread, cut into bite-size pieces, or as needed
- 2 cups milk
- 6 eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 pinch ground cinnamon, or to taste
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar, or as needed

Directions

- Grease a 9x12-inch baking dish.
- Stir 1 cup brown sugar and butter together in a saucepan over medium-low heat until butter melts and sugar dissolves into butter, 2 to 4 minutes. Pour into prepared baking dish and spread a 1 1/2- to 2-inch layer of bread pieces over the top.
- Beat milk, eggs, and vanilla extract together in a bowl; pour milk mixture over bread into the baking dish and move bread as necessary to ensure all bread is absorbing liquid. Sprinkle cinnamon over the top. Cover the dish with plastic wrap and refrigerate, 8 hours to overnight.
- Preheat oven to 450 degrees F (230 degrees C). Remove and discard plastic wrap from baking dish and sprinkle remaining brown sugar over the top of the bread mixture.
- Bake in the preheated oven until browned and bubbling, about 30 minutes.



Christmas Morning Breakfast Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 (5.5 ounce) box Idahoan(R)
 Steakhouse Cheesy
 Hash browns
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 1 cup sliced bacon, diced
- 1 small onion, diced
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 1/2 cup Swiss cheese, shredded

Directions

- Preheat oven to 450 degrees F.
- Prepare Idahoan Steakhouse Cheesy Hashbrown Potatoes, following packaging directions, replacing the 1/2 cup milk with 1/2 cup buttermilk.
- In a medium size skillet, cook bacon & onion until bacon is crisp. Drain and set aside to cool slightly.
- Stir in eggs, Swiss cheese, and bacon-onion mixture.
- Bake uncovered for 25 minutes.
- Sprinkle crunchy onion topping on top of potatoes. Let stand 5 minutes then serve.
