The Crud Cruiser is Coming!

The Crud Cruiser is a mobile collection trailer from the city of Fort Worth that travels to communities to collect household hazardous waste. It will be at the Gateway Church (4205 Basswood Blvd, just west of Beach Street) on Saturday, May 6 from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. This event is for Fort Worth residents only, and commercial, business or industrial waste cannot be accepted under Texas regulations. Bring proof of residency (current water bill, valid driver's license, etc.). **The capacity of the Crud Cruiser is limited, so the event may end earlier than advertised. The event may also be cancelled in the event of rain.**

Waste Handling Instructions

- Leave products in original, marked containers. If unlabeled, please label contents clearly.
- Place leaking containers in a second container of like material (glass for corrosives, metal for flammables).
- Place items securely in boxes or bins (no trash bags) in the trunk of the car or bed of pickup.
- Remain in vehicle and allow staff to unload waste.

BULK TRASH ALERT!



Park Glen continues to have a problem with bulk trash being set out at the curb throughout the month rather than just before the **second Monday of each month.**

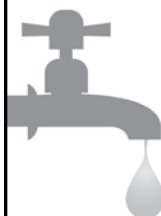

We are always on the lookout for volunteers!! Here is a list of places where you can volunteer your time and serve your community.

Social Committee (Activities & Events) - This committee organizes, promotes and produces a few events throughout the year (Easter Eggstravaganza, July 4th Celebration/ Parade, Turkey Trot, and others).

Communications Committee - Gather information and/or write articles for the monthly newsletter as well as communicating through social media and the Park Glen website.

Hospitality Committee - Greet and welcome each new homeowner to our neighborhood, delivering a welcome gift.

Service Committee - The vision is to build a network of volunteer neighbors who will assist other neighbors as the need arises. For example, an elderly couple who is unable to get their yard cleaned up one week and need some help, we would like to be able to call some folks to help get that yard done for them.

Development Committee - This committee monitors plans and projects and works with local government to exert influence over improvements, infrastructure, and development of our area.

Code Blue: Citizens on Patrol - Volunteers act as additional sets of ears and eyes for the police. Requires brief training at the police academy.

Crime Watch Block Captains - Coordinate and mobilize your neighbors to look out for crime and keep watch for each other. Requires training from the Fort Worth Police.

Architectural Control Committee - This committee will meet biweekly to review requests from homeowners for home improvements in accordance with the requirements of the deed restrictions. This group helps protect our investments in our property.

Village Advisors - These are folks who are willing to be a point of contact for homeowners in their particular neighborhood to help solve any issues or concerns that may come up. Park Glen has 13 different villages and our goal is to get a Village Advisor for each village.

Recipes of the Month

Avocado-Cucumber Salad

Ingredients

- 3/4 to 1 pound seedless cucumber, washed and chopped into chunks
- 2 thin or 1 regular scallions, thinly sliced
- 1 large avocado, pitted and diced
- 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
- Juice of half a lime, plus more to taste
- Salt and hot sauce (we used Sriracha) to taste
- Chopped cilantro or flat-leaf parsley to garnish



Directions

Combine cucumber, scallions and avocado in a bowl. Whisk together mayo, lime and seasonings, adjusting levels to taste. Drizzle salad with dressing and garnish with cilantro or parsley. Repeat again tomorrow

Chocolate Chip and Cherry Blondies

Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted (1 stick)
- 1 cup light brown sugar, packed
- 1 large egg
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt, optional
- 3/4 to 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup cherries (or combination of raspberries, blueberries, strawberries, blackberries; fresh or frozen)



Directions:

Preheat oven to 350F. Line an 8-by-8-inch pan with aluminum foil, spray with cooking spray; set aside.

In a medium microwave-safe bowl, melt the butter, about 60 seconds.

To the melted butter, add the brown sugar and stir to combine.

Add the egg, vanilla, and stir to combine. Add the flour, salt, and stir until just combined, taking care not to over mix or the blondies will be tough.

Fold in chocolate chips, fruit (I don't halve the cherries: I like them chunky and big), and pour batter into prepared pan, smoothing it lightly with a spatula or offset knife if necessary.

Bake for 27 to 32 minutes, or until edges begin to slightly pull away from sides of pan and center is set. Baking time will vary based on types of fruit used, fresh, frozen, and the moisture content of the fruit; and how gooey you like your blondies. A toothpick inserted into the middle may not come out clean due to the chocolate chips or juicy fruit. Allow bars to cool for at least 1 hour before slicing and serving.

Toad Houses and Why You Need Them



Most homeowners spend countless hours and money in order to have beautiful lawns. No matter how much you invest in plants, trees and grass, pesky bugs and insects can destroy it in no time if not dealt with. Don't use harmful harsh chemicals and pesticide instead let toads naturally rid your garden and yard of pests. Toads

are the most natural form of pest control preying on insects, snails, slugs and mosquitos. Studies show that one toad can eat thousands of pests in a single summer.

If you haven't seen toads in your yard, you might need to entice them. You will need a toad house or clay pot to provide toads an escape from predators and from curious pet cats or dogs. You should make sure to find a cool spot and soil that is slightly raised or mounded. Place a toad house on the soil. If you use a clay pot bury it angled halfway in the soil leaving an opening just big enough for the toad to enter.

Toads are amphibians, living on both water and land needing moisture to survive. A clay pot saucer is an excellent choice for providing water for toads. Place both the house and water source close together



near an area that is known to have bugs and insects. It isn't too difficult to attract toads to the garden if the right habitat is provided. Just like humans, toads want to live in a safe place and have plenty of food and water.

It is a fact that the number of amphibians is declining in the world today which may be due to agricultural and residential pesticides. By creating a toad habitat, you could help save the toad population as well as rid your lawn and garden naturally of damaging pest.

Note: If you are currently using harsh chemicals or pesticides, your garden and lawn is too toxic for toads to survive. Even small amounts of chemicals can harm a toad. Before you entice toads to your lawn or garden, remove synthetic fertilizers, fungicides, and herbicides.

Tornado Hits Park Glen!

As tornado sirens went off, many of our residents were hunkering down in their safe spots in their home and then there were some of us who slept through the whole thing. Covenant Corner

This month, we're talking about trees in the "parkway," which is the strip of land between the sidewalk and curb of your property. The trees in this area are required by the city, and removing them could incur a remediation fee from the city. Homeowners are welcome to maintain these trees themselves using good pruning and care techniques, but the city will remove or trim parkway trees that are dead or causing a hazard, such as broken limbs

or low branches over the street or sidewalk (work scheduled based on priority). The city does not do aesthetic trimming (for appearance). A homeowner may request a permit from the city to remove a tree at their own cost, with the requirement (in most cases) that it be replaced. The city even has a free tree program and provides vouchers for free replacement trees (5-gallon, approximately 2-4 feet tall) in certain cases.

To get more information, request a tree removal permit, or report a tree hazard

on your property or another, call the Fort Worth Forestry section at 817-392-5738 or visit their website at www.FortWorthTexas.gov/Forestry. There is also some good information on that site regarding the best trees for our area and how to plant and care for trees.

In addition to a city permit, HOA approval is required prior to removal of a tree. Visit the ParkGlen.org website for the Property Modification Request form and information. Please note that the Park Glen Neighborhood Association requires homeowners to remove or grind down stumps to below ground level, even though the city does not do this when they remove trees.
