

Advance voting for this year's Board of Directors election will begin approximately August 10 and run through Noon on September 10. It is necessary to reach a minimum quorum of ballots cast before the election can be concluded, so all homeowners are encouraged to vote online, by paper ballot, by designating a proxy, or (best of all) by coming to the annual meeting on September 11 and voting in person. - August 10 (approximate) Advance Voting period opens for the 2018 Board election as homeowners start receiving voting information and ballots in the mail from Election-America.
- September 10 Advance voting for the 2018 Board election ends at noon
- September 10 Annual Meeting attend and vote in person 7pm -Longhorn Council Activity Center - 5350 Basswood Blvd.

Homeowners may vote for all or some of the races or cast ballots to meet quorum without voting for any candidates. If you have any questions about the online voting process, you may contact Election America at 866-384-9978.

### **COVENANT CORNER**



### Tips to Avoid Deed Restriction Violations

- Your trash and recycling carts should be in your garage or in your backyard behind your fence except for the 24 hours they are at the curb.
- Always request approval before doing a property modification or improvement.
- All storage sheds require approval. Only certain kinds, sizes, and locations of shed are allowed.
- A fence higher than 6' tall may not intersect with or connect to a shorter fence.
- Partial fences (a fence segment with one or both ends not connected to the home or the main fence) are not allowed.
- Keep your fences, retaining walls, garage doors, and house maintained.
- If a part of your home is less than attractive because it needs painting, request approval of the color (even if the same color) and have it repainted.
- Window air conditioning units are not allowed.
- Your yard does not have to be gorgeous, but it should have grass and be consistently mowed, trimmed, and edged. Shrubs should be trimmed to be neat and attractive. Low tree branches over streets and sidewalks should be trimmed.
- Tree stumps must be ground down or removed.
   Empty tree wells must be removed or have a tree planted in them.
- Portable basketball goals may not be kept in or near the street.
- Boats, trailers, and RV's may not be stored in or visible from the street. Vehicles may never be parked in the grass.
- Vehicles that are inoperable, undriveable, unlicensed, or under repair may be kept only in the garage.


### PID6 Advisory Board




### **Healthy After-**School Snacks.

### Frozen Yogurt Grapes

- 1. Freeze the grapes. All you need to do is pick the grapes from the stem, rinse them and then place them on a baking sheet. It takes a couple of hours for the grapes to freeze all the way.
- 2. Dip the grapes in yogurt. I let the grapes thaw for just a few minutes because it was easier to get the toothpick in them. Dip in your favorite yogurt and then place back on your baking sheet.

Tip: If you want to roll it in a topping, do it right after you dip in the yogurt. The yogurt will freeze pretty fast because the grape is





### Frozen Banana Bites

- 1. Grab some bananas and cut them into chunks. Arrange on a cookie sheet lined with wax paper or parchment paper with a toothpick in each banana.
- 2. Freeze first, bananas only, for about 1-2 hours. This is the most important part! Dipping a banana that isn't frozen makes the process difficult and messy! After bananas are frozen, the chocolate adheres to the banana much more easily.
- 3. Melt some chocolate chips (semi sweet if you like it or milk chocolate).
- 4. Take bananas out of the freezer and dip each one in the melted chocolate, and then in a bowl full of coconut.
- 5. Return bananas to the freezer until the chocolate hardens up

### Crunchy Roasted Chick Peas

- 1. First, drain a can of chickpeas, also called Garbanzo beans, or start with cooked beans and rinse them well.
- 2. Then, spread the beans out on a cookie sheet with foil (you could use parchment paper), and dry them with a towel. You want these dry! The drier they are the better and crunchier they will turn out. Many people have trouble getting their beans to that "crunchy" stage, and they end up mushy. One thing to really help with that, is to make sure they are going into your oven without any water left on them.
- 3. Drizzle with olive oil, and if you choose, Parmesan cheese and salt or your favorite seasonings.
- 4. Cook them in the oven at 400 degrees for 30-35 minutes. Tip: This snack is super easy to make, and super healthy for the

kids! They can eat them plain, you could sprinkle them on salads or add them to trail mix!

# Park Glen Neighborhood Association Volunteer Opportunities



We are always on the lookout for volunteers!! Here is a list of areas where you can volunteer to serve your community.

<u>Architectural Control Committee</u> - This committee reviews requests from homeowners for home improvements in accordance with the requirements of the deed restrictions. This group helps protect our investments in our property.

**Hospitality Committee** - Visit and welcome each new homeowner, delivering a welcome gift.

<u>Social Committee (Activities & Events)</u> - This committee organizes, promotes and produces a few events throughout the year (Easter Eggstravaganza, July 4th Parade, Turkey Trot, and others). We especially need volunteers to coordinate entire events or parts of events, but there are opportunities to just help at events.

<u>Host a Block Party</u> - We need volunteers to put together a block party on your street for the annual "National Night Out" (first Tuesday in October) or any other time throughout the year. We'll provide guidance and ideas to help you bring your neighbors together to make your part of Park Glen safer and friendlier.

<u>Sign Distribution & Pick Up around the Neighborhood</u> - Will you be part of a rotation of volunteers who give an hour or two per month to distribute or pick up signs that we put up around the neighborhood to promote events and programs?

<u>Newsletter Editor</u> - Compile provided articles and material into a monthly newsletter file for publication on our website. Requires good understanding of Microsoft Publisher or another good newsletter publishing program.

<u>Communications Committee</u> - Gather information, write articles for the monthly newsletter, and/or post on social media and the Park Glen website.

<u>Citizens on Patrol (Code Blue)</u> - Volunteers work directly with the Fort Worth Police Department and act as additional sets of ears and eyes for the police. Requires training.

<u>Crime Watch Block Captains</u> - Coordinate and mobilize your neighbors to look out for crime and keep watch for each other. Requires training from the Fort Worth Police.

<u>Service Committee</u> - Join a network of volunteer neighbors who will assist other neighbors as the need arises. For example, an elderly couple who is unable to get their yard cleaned up one week and need some help, we would like to be able to call some folks to help get that yard done for them. This committee also coordinates volunteer clean-up of our parks and creek beds. To be reactivated, this committee needs a chairperson.

<u>Yard of the Month & Holiday Decoration Contest Selection</u> - You can help select yard of the month or Christmas decorating winners in a Park Glen village other than your own.

<u>Set Up and Take Down Audio Visual Equipment</u> at Pool/Movie nights three or four Saturdays in the Summer and possibly other times.

IF PERSONAL CONTACT WITH THE TEACHER ISN'T POSSIBLE, TRY LOCATING THE TEACHER'S PICTURE ON A SCHOOL WEBSITE OR IN A YEARBOOK, SO YOUR CHILD CAN PUT A NAME WITH A FACE. IF YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER SENDS A WELCOME LETTER, BE SURE TO READ THE LETTER TOGETHER.

### **T**OUR THE SCHOOL

IF YOUR SCHOOL HOSTS AN OPEN HOUSE, BE SURE TO GO. FAMILIARIZING YOUR CHILD WITH HER ENVIRONMENT WILL HELP HER AVOID A NERVOUS STOMACH ON THE FIRST DAY. TOGETHER YOU CAN MEET HER TEACHER, FIND HER DESK, OR EXPLORE THE PLAYGROUND.

WITH AN OLDER CHILD, YOU MIGHT ASK HIM TO GIVE YOU A TOUR OF THE SCHOOL. THIS WILL HELP REFRESH HIS MEMORY AND YOURS.

### **CONNECT WITH FRIENDS.**

A FAMILIAR FRIEND CAN MAKE ALL THE DIFFERENCE WHEN HEADING BACK TO SCHOOL. YOU MIGHT TRY CALLING PARENTS FROM LAST YEAR'S CLASS AND FINDING OUT WHICH CHILDREN ARE IN YOUR CHILD'S CLASS THIS YEAR. REFRESH THESE RELATIONSHIPS BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS BY SCHEDULING A PLAY DATE OR A SCHOOL CARPOOL.

### TOOL UP.

OBTAIN THE CLASS SUPPLY LIST AND TAKE A SPECIAL SHOPPING TRIP WITH YOUR CHILD. HAVING THE RIGHT TOOLS WILL HELP HIM FEEL PREPARED. WHILE KEEPING BASIC NEEDS IN MIND, ALLOW FOR A COUPLE OF SPLURGES LIKE A COOL NOTEBOOK OR A FAVORITE-COLORED PEN. THESE SIMPLE PLEASURES MAKE GOING BACK TO SCHOOL A LOT MORE FUN.

SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS ALSO PROVIDE GREAT INSIGHT INTO THE SCHOOLWORK AHEAD. GET YOUR CHILD EXCITED ABOUT UPCOMING PROJECTS BY EXPLAINING HOW NEW SUPPLIES MIGHT BE USED. LET HIM PRACTICE USING SUPPLIES THAT HE'S NOT USED BEFORE - SUCH AS COLORED PENCILS OR A PROTRACTOR - SO HE WILL BE COMFORTABLE USING THEM IN CLASS.


### **E**ASE INTO THE ROUTINE.


