# TRINITY METRO TEXRail<sup>SM</sup>



## TIME TO TRAIN

Trinity Metro's TEXRail is a new 27-mile commuter rail line that extends from downtown Fort Worth, Texas, across northeast Tarrant County, through North Richland Hills and Grapevine, and into Dallas Fort Worth International Airport's Terminal B. This line, served by nine stations, begins service Jan. 5, 2019, and is projected to serve more than 8,000 daily riders by the end of the first year of operation. By 2035, nearly 14,000 daily riders are projected to ride TEXRail.



## FAST FACTS

- TEXRail will feature diesel multiple units (DMUs) with a mechanical unit in the center of the train.
- Each DMU has 229 seats and total capacity of 488. There are four entry points on each side of the train.
- TEXRail cars feature an all-aluminum body and an articulated train that makes it easy to walk between cars during the ride.
- Amenities include a designated quiet car, level boarding, bike racks, USB charging stations, seatback trays and overhead luggage storage.
- TEXRail will operate seven days a week.
