




PGNA Scholarship Program

Applications may be submitted between May 1 and June 1. It will be a 3-page application that calls also for 2 letters of recommendation, a recent transcript, and a 1-2 paragraph written response to a topic question. This scholarship program is for college or university study in the fall 2021 semester and is NOT just for high school seniors.

Beware of Phone Scams

Beware of phone callers posing as a Social Security Administration Employee asking for your Social Security number or last four digits, etc.

Please be aware that there is a large scam going on right now where scammers are calling individuals on their home or cell phones and telling them that their Social Security Account has been compromised. They will tell their name and Federal ID# and ask for your Social Security number or last 4 digits so that they can look up your case. Please do not give the caller any information. You can call





Fort Worth at: 866-613-2745, to check and see if there actually is an issue with your account. You can also call the Social Security Fraud Section to report the fraudulent call at: 800-269-0271. The Social Security Administration will never call and ask for your Social Security number. They will instead always send any issue or information by postal mail.

PGNA Landscape Corner

Telephone interview with Mike Sutton, homeowner, and professional horticulturalist.

*1 - The subzero temperatures and the 160+ hours below freezing this past February have injured and perhaps some of our more, cold sensitive plants have even succumbed to the below normal cold. Mike recommends waiting till as late as May 1 to see if any new growth emerges, then prune back any dead branches to the new growth.

Any plant in a weakened condition could benefit from root stimulator, but do not apply fertilizer.

For shrubs and small trees, you can apply a root stimulator by mixing in a bucket per directions and applying at the trunk and out 3 feet from trunk.

- *2 In regards to lawns, Bermuda can have a pre-emergent applied to it, but avoid pre-emergent this spring on St. Augustine lawns due to the weakened condition caused by freeze injury. Around mid-April or when lawn is 50% green apply the spring fertilizer. If your St. Augustine lawn has suffered over 50% loss from the freeze hold off on the fertilizer and apply a root stimulator product with a hose end sprayer.
- *3 A local garden center usually employs an experienced landscape professional that you can contact if you have more specific questions.

Lastly, if you need to replace any plants come May 1st, you may want to consider replacing them with more cold tolerant plants.









Community-wide Landscape Bulletin (B1.07) adopted this past August to make it easier to improve your Front Yard!

In the past and currently there are many yards that have a lot of shade from large canopy trees and it's difficult to grow grass. The new B1.07 Community-wide Bulletin allows for more options such as shrubs and ground covers that can be used instead of sod. The intention is that this new bulletin will encourage and allow homeowners to make their front yards look the best that they can while still

homeowners to make their front yards look the best that they can while still keeping the large shade trees that make Park Glen unique and special.

If you have to replace a lot of landscaping because of the winter storm, you might also want to take a look at the new B1.07 Bulletin.


May 26th-29th, June 23rd-26th, July 21st-24th & August 18th-21st


PID6 - Community-wide Garage Sales

Classic Monte Cristo Sandwich

Prep Time: 10 minutes
Cook Time: 10 minutes
Total Time: 20 Minutes

Servings: 1

Ingredients

3 slices white sandwich bread

1/4 pound ham (or turkey)

1/2 cup grated gouda cheese

2 teaspoons mayonnaise (opt.)

1 large egg

2 tablespoons milk


1 teaspoon paprika

Salt and pepper

2 tablespoons butter, for cooking

Instructions

- 1) Lay out three slices of sandwich bread. Split grated cheese between two slices of bread. (You can sub
 - smoked gouda if you want). Top cheese with sliced ham.



- 3) Slices the ends off the sandwich and press it with some weight to really compact the layers. You can just cover it with a flat plate or cutting board and press on it gently for a few seconds.
- 4) Whisk together the egg, milk, paprika, and a pinch of salt and pepper.
- 5) Heat butter in a small skillet over medium heat.
- 6) When butter is melted, dredge the pressed sandwich in the egg mixture, coating all sides. Immediately move sandwich to the skillet. Cook for 3-4 minutes per side until the sandwich is golden brown. Also, upend the sandwich to cook on the ends for about 15 seconds per side.

Sandwich is done cooking when it is a dark golden brown and cheese is completely melted. Cut sandwich in half and serve immediately!

Carrot Cake Recipe with Cream Cheese Frosting

Prep Time: 20 minutes Cook Time: 60 minutes

Total Time: 1 hour 20 Minutes

Servings: 12 slices

Ingredients

2 1/2 Cups Carrots shredded

4 Eggs

2 Cups Sugar

1 tsp Vanilla Essence

1 1/2 Cups Oil

2 Cups Flour

2 tsp Baking Soda

2 tsp Cinnamon

1/2 tsp Salt

1 Quantity Cream Cheese Frosting



Instructions

Add the shredded carrots, egg, sugar, vanilla and oil to a medium sized mixing bowl. Use a wooden spoon to combine the ingredients together.

Sieve the flour, baking soda, salt and cinnamon together into a seperate bowl.

Pour the wet ingredients into the bowl with the dry ingredients. Fold the cake batter together until you no longer see any dry flour. Be careful here no to over mix the batter.

Pour the carrot cake batter into a lined and greased 8" or 20cm cake pan. Bake in a 170 C / 340 F oven for about 60 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean.

Cool the cake for 20 minutes in the cake pan before transferring to a wire rack. While the cake is cooling make the Cream Cheese Frosting.


Slice the cooled cake through the center and cover the bottom cake layer in cream cheese frosting. Top with the next cake layer and decorate the cake with the remaining frosting.

Leave the cake to set for about 30 minutes before slicing and enjoying.

Notes: ¼ Cup of chopped Walnuts can be added to the batter before baking.

The cake will keep at room temperature for 3-4 days. Keep it in an airtight container to retain freshness.
