



THE SNAKE - PART 2


We have a number of different snakes in our park. I have seen Western Rat snakes, Rough Green snakes, Diamond Backed Water Snakes, DeKay's Brown snakes, Plain Bellied Water snakes, and Racer snakes, which are all non-venomous. However, this does not mean that they won't bite you if you handle them.



Western Rat Snake (Pantherophis obsoletus) - Non-Venomous This snake belongs to the Colubridae, which is the largest snake family. They are usually around 4-6 ft long but can grow up to 8 ft. Their eggs hatch after about 65 to 70 days in late August /early October. The hatchlings are between 10 and 16 inches in length.

The Western Rat Snake is a constrictor, and its diet includes rats, mice, voles, squirrels, other snakes, rabbits, birds, opossums, and bird eggs. They are excellent climbers and will

scale the walls of buildings with the greatest of ease. Their preferred habitat is a heavily wooded area, so the park here offers them almost perfect conditions. If they feel threatened, they may make a quick getaway or try to imitate a rattlesnake by shaking the end of their tail rapidly. They can also produce a foul-smelling musk, which they will release if they are picked up.



Rough Green Snake (Opheodrys aestivus) - Non-Venomous
These snakes are quite long and very slender. They can reach
lengths of almost three feet and are bright green in color with a
yellow or whitish belly. They are excellent tree climbers, but
you can also see them on the pathways, soaking up the sunshine.

They spend the majority of their time hunting for insects, spiders, etc. in the vegetation above the ground. If you come upon a Rough Green snake, it will probably freeze and rely on its coloration to protect them although this does not work so well on concrete pathways. It's a good idea to tickle them with a piece of grass to encourage them to move away from the concrete so that they don't get run over by a bicycle. In the cooler weather, Rough Green Snakes often can be found hiding beneath logs, rocks, or other debris. Mating takes place in the early spring and the females lay between 3 and 12 eggs in early summer.



Diamondback Water Snake (Nerodia rhombifer) - Non-Venomous

This snake is predominantly brown, dark brown, or dark olive green in color, with a black net-like pattern along the back, with each spot being somewhat diamond-shaped. It is one of the most common species of snake within its range and is mainly found near slow-moving bodies of water such as streams, rivers, ponds, and swamps. A bite from this snake is quite painful because they have sharp teeth which help them when they catch fish. They breed in the spring and give birth in the late summer or early fall. The embryos develop inside eggs that remain in their mother's body until they are ready to hatch. The diamondback water snake is often mistaken for the Cottonmouth or Rattlesnake and is killed out of fear. This is really unfortunate because the diamondback water snake and other species of water snakes are far more common than venomous snakes.





Cinnamon Roll Bites



COURSE: BREAKFAST, DESSERT CUISINE: AMERICAN
PREP TIME: 15 MINUTES COOK TIME: 25 MINUTES

Treat yourself to these buttery, cinnamon and brown sugar coated bites right out of the oven -- they come together in no time!

INGREDIENTS

BISCUIT DOUGH

- 2 cups flour (whole wheat, all purpose, or a mix)
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup cold butter
- 3/4-1 cup cold milk

CINNAMON SUGAR COATING

- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- · 1 tbsp cinnamon
- 3/4 cup butter, melted

GLAZE:

- · 1/3 cup icing sugar
- 1-2 tbsp milk just enough to bring the glaze together

INSTRUCTIONS

- In a large bowl, combine flour, baking powder and salt (I mix with my pastry cutter).
- Cut the butter into cubes and add to the bowl.Cut in the butter with a pastry cutter or fork until butter is in pea-sized pieces.
- Stir in milk gradually, adding just enough so that the dough comes together. Bring together in a ball with your hands (if you accidentally add too much milk and it becomes sticky, just add a little more flour).
- 4. *See post above for make ahead directions.
- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Lightly grease a 10" pie plate or baking dish.
- 6. In a medium bowl, combine brown sugar, granulated sugar and cinnamon. Roll dough into 1" balls. Dip balls in remaining melted butter and then coat in cinnamon sugar mixture and place in the pie plate.
- Drizzle remaining butter over the dough balls in the pan. Bake for 20-25 minutes until biscuits are cooked and butter/sugar mixture is bubbling in the bottom of the pan.
- *If you're using a pie plate smaller than 10", it's a good idea to place a piece of tin foil in the oven under the plate to catch any possible drips.

Christmas Sugar Cookies Bars



Christmas Sugar Cookie Bars

These soft Christmas sugar cookie bars have a sweet and delicious flavor and buttercream frosting that will melt in your mouth as soon as you take a bite.



INGREDIENTS

Sugar Cookie Bars

- · 2 cups all-purpose flour
- · 2 teaspoon cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- · ¼ cup salted sweet cream butter, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- · 1 tablespoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- · 2 large eggs, room temperature
- · 4 tablespoons Christmas nonpareil sprinkles (red, green and white)

Buttercream Frosting

- · 1 cup salted sweet cream butter, softened
- · 1 teaspoon clear vanilla flavoring
- · 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- . 2 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- · 4 to 5 tablespoons heavy cream
- · Christmas nonpareil sprinkles (red, green and white)

INSTRUCTIONS

Sugar Cookie Barr

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9x9 baking dish with a parchment paper "sling". Spray with baking spray (Baker's joy or generic version). Set it aside.
- 2. In a small mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, cornstarch and baking powder. Set it aside.
- Using a medium size mixing bowl and a handheld mixer on high speed, beat the softened butter for 1 minute.

- Add the granulated sugar, vanilla and almond extract, and continue beating for 1 to 1 ½ minutes, until fluffy.
- 5. Lower the mixer speed to low, and add the eggs 1 at a time, beating well after each egg.
- Increase the mixer speed to medium-low. Add the flour mixture 1 cup at a time, beating well after each cup just until well incorporated.
- 7. Add in the sprinkles, and mix just until combined.
- Evenly spread the cookie dough into the bottom of the prepared baking dish. Bake for 20 to 22
 minutes until just golden, and a toothpick inserted comes away clean.
- 9. Allow the cookie bars to completely cool.

Buttercream Frosting

- Using a medium size mixing bowl and a handheld mixer on medium-high speed, beat the softened butter, clear vanilla and almond extract for 1 minute.
- Lower the mixer speed to low and add the powdered sugar ½ cup at a time, alternating with the heavy cream. Once all powdered sugar and cream is added, increase the mixer speed to mediumhigh and mix for 1 to ½ minutes until smooth.
- Once the sugar cookie bars are completely cooled, use the parchment paper sling to remove the sugar cookie bars from the baking dish.
- 4. Using a silicone spatula or offset spatula to evenly spread the frosting.
- 5. Evenly sprinkle the holiday sprinkles over the frosting. Slice the bars 1 $\ensuremath{\text{V}}_2$ x 3 inch slices.

NOTES

- You do not have to use the parchment paper sling, but it does make it easier to lift the bars out of the pan.
- . Don't skip the cornstarch; it's the secret ingredient that makes the bars extra soft.
- Oven temperatures vary and may need to be recalibrated periodically to ensure they are accurate. Make sure to check your cookie bars at the lower end of the recommended baking time.
