## PGNA Sprinkler Maintenance Workshop March 9, 2024



Kyle Jensen, a local irrigation specialist, recently shared invaluable insights on making the most of our sprinkler systems. Here's a quick recap to keep your lawns lush while conserving water:

### **Workshop Highlights:**

**Understanding the Basics**: We delved into key terminology, from the main water supply to soil saturation, ensuring everyone speaks the 'water language.'

**Product Know-How:** From spray heads to turf drips, Kyle covered the ideal uses for different sprinkler products, focusing on achieving efficient water usage with the right tools for various garden areas.

**Water Habits**: Common misconceptions were addressed, emphasizing that more water isn't always better and the importance of matching precipitation rates for optimal coverage.

**Smart Watering Practices**: We learned to calculate water usage effectively and adjust our watering schedules based on the garden's needs, preventing wastage and unnecessary costs.

Final Tips: Key takeaways included knowing your watering days, ensuring sprinkler heads are unobstructed, and applying the minimum amount of water needed—aim for 1 inch per week.


#### **Next Steps:**

### Birds by M. L. Keller

Wildlife in Arcadia Park and the surrounding area



Park Glen is a suburban neighborhood with a large park and green spaces that can attract a variety of bird species. Specific bird sightings can vary depending on factors such as seasonality and habitat. By exploring the park, green spaces, and wooded areas of the community, you can enjoy observing these avian inhabitants in their natural habitat throughout the year.

Whether it's the cheerful songs of chickadees or the vibrant plumage of goldfinches, each species contributes to the natural beauty of the region's avian community.

Predatory birds play crucial roles in North Texas ecosystems, helping to regulate populations of prey species and contributing to the overall balance of the region's wildlife communities.

In North Texas, several species of herons, egrets, and other wading birds can also be commonly observed hunting for fish in wetlands, lakes, rivers, and ponds. These fish-eating birds also play important roles in the ecosystems of North Texas, helping to regulate fish populations and maintain the health of wetland habitats.

### Prescribed Burn Planned for Arcadia Prairie

The City of Fort Worth Park and Recreation Department (PARD), with the support of PID 6 and the Park Glen Neighborhood Association, is planning to conduct a prescribed burn on the prairie adjacent to Rincon Way in Summer, 2024. The prescribed burn is being implemented to improve the health of the prairie by removing invading shrubs, reducing the amount of dead woody flood debris, and enhancing the health and diversity of the native plant community. Due to the small size of the prescribed burn (9.7 acres), limited smoke impacts are expected. The prescribed burn will be conducted with southerly winds which will result in smoke impacts to areas of the Park between the prairie and Island Circle.



The park will remain open during the prescribed burn however adjacent trails and amenities will be closed for safety. The burn is expected to last 30 minutes to 1 hour, but will be monitored until all sources of heat are extinguished.

PARD has been conducting prescribed burns to improve natural areas since 1980. PARD conducts each burn in cooperation with personnel and resources from Fort Worth Fire Department and other surrounding prescribed fire practitioners.

Fort Worth has a long history of fire. This area historically burned every 1-3 years on average prior to settlement (~1850). Lightning and Native Americans were responsible for starting pre-settlement fires. Native Americans used intentional fires to protect their camps from unintended fires, and also to attract hunted wildlife populations to lush new plant growth.

Prescribed burns require specific weather and environmental conditions to safely conduct. As such, it is impossible to schedule a burn well in advance. PARD staff will monitor conditions and begin sending out more frequent communication as the appropriate conditions materialize. The burn could be delayed until winter or even the following year if safe conditions do not develop.
