Don't Get Distracted: Just Drive!!

According to the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), more than 2,000 people have been killed by distracted drivers on Texas roadways since 2017, when it became illegal to read, write or send a text while driving. The agency also reports that about one in six car crashes in Texas during 2022 were due to distracted driving.

Distracted Driving: Distracted driving occurs anytime you take your hands off the wheel, your mind off driving, or your eyes off the road. Texting is especially hazardous because it involves all three distractions at once. In fact, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), sending or reading a text at 55 mph is equivalent to driving the length of an entire football field with your eyes closed. Even while using a hands-free device, your mind shifts from focusing on the road to your conversation.

Focused Driving: The important thing to remember about distracted driving is that it's a choice. By deciding to stay focused on the road, you can help keep yourself and others safe. • Before moving, set your GPS and music, then put your phone away. • While driving, concentrate on the environment around you, including other vehicles, pedestrians, and objects on the road. • Keep your hands on the wheel at all times. • Avoid using any electronics while driving, including your phone and navigation system. • Avoid eating or drinking while driving.

Driving During the School Year: Focusing solely on driving while behind the wheel is especially important during the school year. You can help keep children safe by increasing your awareness around school buses and school zones. Be prepared to stop for school buses and follow them at a safe distance. Obey school zone speed limits. Stay alert for children around school crosswalks and nearby intersections. Be prepared to stop for children who might run across the road to their school or bus.

Dealing with distractions: Distractions will arise. When they do, the best solution is to find a safe location and pull over. Once your vehicle is stopped, you can more safely approach tasks such as using your cell phone, looking up directions, eating or drinking, finding something you dropped, or resuming an emotionally intense or complex conversation

Wildlife in Arcadia Park and the surrounding area

Egrets

Egrets are protected under various conservation laws because of several reasons: habitat loss, hunting and exploitation, and ecological importance.



Cattle Egret

In North Texas, several species of egrets can be found, including the great egret, snowy egret, and cattle egret.

These birds primarily inhabit wetland areas such as marshes, lakes, and rivers, although they can also be spotted in other environments like fields and pastures. Egrets are important for maintaining the ecological balance of their habitats by controlling populations of small animals like fish and insects.

Egrets typically nest in colonies, known as rookeries or heronries, which are often located in tall trees near water bodies. They often select trees with sturdy branches or dense foliage, which offer stability and concealment for their nests. Egret nests are constructed from sticks, twigs, and other vegetation, forming large platform-like structures where the eggs are laid and incubated.

During the breeding season, which typically occurs in the spring or early summer, these colonies become bustling hubs of activity as egrets engage in courtship displays, mate selection, nest building, egg laying, and chick rearing. The incubation period for egret eggs typically ranges from 21 to 25 days, depending on the species and environmental conditions. During this time, the parent birds take turns incubating the eggs, keeping them warm and protected until they hatch. Once the eggs hatch, the baby egrets, called chicks or nestlings, are initially blind and naked, relying entirely on their parents for warmth, protection, and food. The chicks grow rapidly over the next few weeks, quickly gaining feathers and gradually becoming more independent as they grow. They remain in the nest for several weeks, receiving care and protection from their parents until they are old enough to fledge, or leave the nest. Fledging typically occurs around 6 to 7 weeks after hatching, although this can vary depending on factors such as food availability and environmental conditions. After fledging, the young egrets continue to receive parental care and guidance as they learn to forage for food and navigate their surroundings. Eventually, they become fully independent and may join other egrets in communal roosts and foraging areas.

After the breeding season concludes, egrets may disperse to forage in other areas, although some individuals or pairs may remain in the vicinity of the colony year-round.

If you're looking to deter egrets from a particular area, it's necessary to do it before they start breeding. There are a few non-harmful methods you can try: remove food sources, visual deterrents (placing shiny objects, such as aluminum foil strips or reflective tape, in the area can sometimes scare egrets away), noise (such as wind chimes), physical barriers.

It's essential to use humane methods to deter wildlife, and in some cases, it may be necessary to seek guidance from local wildlife authorities or conservation organizations for effective and ethical solutions.

Remember, wildlife was here long before we humans arrived and invaded their habitat.


The Parade, along with the Keller Central Marching Band, will start at approximately 9:35 and will end at about 10:00 am.

- June 21 to July 23 Candidate Filing period.
- Candidate names & statements will be posted on the Park Glen website as filings come in.
- Approximately August 7 YesElections sends letter, candidate information sheet, and voting instructions to each homeowner.
- •By August 9 YesElections sets up the website for voting.
- •August 9 (or earlier) to September 10 Advance Voting period.
- <u>September 10 -</u> Annual Meeting; in-person voting; results made known (assuming quorum has been met).

Park Glen's community management company,

Neighborhood Management, Inc., will be coordinating the 2024 election. With regard to candidate filing, NMI will:

- collect candidate filings
- verify homeowner status at filing submission and again right after filing ends
- confirm receipt of filings to applicants
