Please enter through the south drop-off entrance.

Homeowners can vote starting on August 9, 2024 at 9:00 am:

- electronically (online) by 7:30 pm on September 10, 2024
- by mail (must be received in the YesElections office by 12 noon on September 10, 2024)
- by proxy (deadline to request a paper proxy is August 23, 2024)
- via ballot drop-off box by September 10, 2024 at 6 pm, located outside of Neighborhood Management's (NMI) office at 5421 Basswood Blvd, Suite 710 (2 doors down from Premier Eye Care)
- or in-person at the September 10, 2024 Annual Meeting from 7:00 pm to 7:30 pm.

Information on the Annual Meeting and how to vote in the election, along with election code and voting pin, will be sent to each homeowner by US Mail on August 7th. An email will also be sent to those whose email is registered with our Management Company, NMI.

Any questions or if you have technical difficulty with the election process, need election code and voting pin to vote online, or if you would like to request a paper proxy form (to designate another member to vote in person on September 10 on your behalf), please contact YesElections from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Eastern Time by e-mail at Help+PGNA@yeselections.com or by phone at 877-466-7875. The deadline to request a paper proxy is August 23.
